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

Sacred Heart Mona Vale – Term 2 Week 3, 15 May 2019

Parliament and Civics Education Rebate (PACER)

Students from our school will soon be undertaking an education tour of the national capital on Thursday 6 and Friday 7 June 2019. Students will be given the opportunity to participate in a variety of educational programs with a focus on Australia's history, culture, heritage and democracy.

The Australian Government recognises the importance of all young Australians being able to visit the national capital as part of their Civics and Citizenship education. To assist families in meeting the cost of the excursion the Australian Government is contributing funding of \$20 per student under the Parliament and Civics Education Rebate program towards those costs. The rebate is paid directly to the school upon completion of the excursion.

Positive Behaviours for Learning

Last week the Broken Bay Catholic Schools Office ran a two day conference with Dr Tim Lewis from the University of Missouri. The conference was looking at school wide Positive Behaviour Interventions and Supports which our school refers to as 'Positive Behaviour for Learning'.

The conference outlined how in order to enhance and improve children's learning- you need to have effective classroom practices and whole school expectations for behaviour. The conference reaffirmed all the work that Sacred Heart has been doing for a number of years around the implementation of PBL multi-tiered systems of support (Tiers 1-3) and the conversation that the members of the community have in supporting all children to have pro-social learning behaviours. This is evident in the universal approach of evidence based practices and the learning environment that is created at Sacred Heart.

How is this evident at Sacred Heart?

- The explicit teaching of the Core Value such as this term 'Compassion'
- The weekly expectation for behaviour 'Include someone who is alone on the playground'
- The use of looking for the positive and rewarding with the '*Reasons to Smile*', merit awards, Principal awards and positive feedback.
- The tracking of Long Time Out data and the work of the Wellbeing team that meets twice a term.
- The design of learning environments with a variety of seating, group work and task design.
- The teaching, reteaching and redirecting to positive behaviours for learning.

Family Engagement and Social Emotional Learning

It was so wonderful to see so many Mums and family members at the Mother's Day Breakfast and Mass. By making connections with families, students and teachers. You, as a parent, are providing your child with the opportunity to talk and share about their learning. As well as creating and fostering a sense of community that promotes inclusion and respect for everybody.

The children across all classes on Tuesday also visited each others' classrooms to look at and learn about each others' learning. These opportunities allow for children to be more caring and compassionate towards others, feel safer and more secure at school. It also provides student voice and agency as children are asked questions by others to reflect and think about their learning.
