Dear Parents

This Sunday is the Solemnity of the most Holy Trinity John 6: 12-15.

Understanding the Trinity is a challenge. How can there be three in one, Father, Son and Holy Spirit? The Director of Spirituality at Canisius College at Pymble suggested the following:

Mystery beyond us (God the Father) Word all around us (Jesus) Love within us and among us (Holy Spirit)

Our Inspire and Innovate program continued this week in Kindergarten, Year 1 and Year 2.

Andrew, our Apple educator, worked with Year 2 students to use sketching tools and to save their images to be used in their Information reports. Teachers have commented:

"The students are learning to 'struggle' a little longer to develop persistence rather than asking the teacher immediately for help. From observation, the time spent on problem solving is increasing. Much communication and collaboration were evident."

"In Year 1 the student's task was to find pictures of shelters in Safari, present them in Picollage and then add them to Book Creator. The students worked on the cover of their shelter book today and will add to this in the next few weeks. In reading groups over the next few weeks they will add more pages to their book on shelters."

Kindergarten were engaged in taking photos and cropping images. They enjoyed photographing red objects and then practiced cropping around these objects. Next week we they will be taking more photos and practising cropping and then placing these photos into Pic Collage."

We are interested in contacting painters who could quote for repainting the railings and other various jobs to refresh our school environment. Are there any parents interested in quoting? If so please contact the school office. Painters must be licensed and hold all insurances and WWC.

Yesterday a lockdown drill was performed at Sacred Heart. From the evaluation it was pleasing to note that all responded quickly and appropriately according to set procedures. Lockdown and evacuation drills are performed each term as timetabled in the EWS Annual Plan.

Semester reports will go home on Wednesday 19 June by email. Parents are invited to make an appointment with their classroom teacher for the following week commencing Monday 24 June.

School Life Surveys

At Sacred Heart the children across K-6 have taken part in the School Life Survey.

Each child in K-2 complete a paper survey where they are asked questions around Liking School; Feeling Safe; Social Skills; Friends and Me.

Children in Years 3 - 6 complete a Google Form asking questions around learning and behaviour in the classrooms and how happy and safe they feel on the playground and at school. The results showed students spoke positively about their learning and how the teacher supported their learning by explaining, drawing, giving examples, positive feedback, coming around the room, checking what students are doing, showing examples, and answering questions.

Students showed a positive response to feeling happy and safe in the playground with over 78% of students stating they felt great to really great and 83.5% stating how happy and safe they were at school.

Students' comments about the playground were extremely positive



overall with students commenting on the different playing areas, the games of handball, the interactions with other children the Library and their friends.




