Student Voice and Student Leadership

At Sacred Heart the school year is now underway. We really encourage the transition to school or year or year to be a successful time and work hard at developing a sense of belonging and community. As the students grow they have many roles and responsibilities which create opportunities for active participation in School Life. By creating active participation students develop networks to feel connected and sense of purpose.



Did you know that our Year 4 children run the Toy Shed? The Toy Shed has many things that children can play with at lunchtime such as buckets, spades and blocks for the oval or sandpit.

Did you know that our Year 5 children organise our playground bins? This job creates leadership opportunities for our students to develop their leadership skills of organising, being accountable and motivation.

Did you know that each class has an Eco Leader and SRC Representative? These student leaders represent their classes' student voice on issues such as Reusing, Recycling and Reducing Waste. This week we had our first meeting around our new Classroom Waste Management Systems. Students were given the opportunity to survey their class about our new paper, general waste and composting bins. They also surveyed about having student's names clearly labelled on school hats for quick return and reduction in Lost Property. Our Year 6 Eco and SRC Leaders spoke to Year 5 about their roles and responsibilities and also relabelled our Blue Boxes for Lunchboxes and equipment on the playground.




The role of feeling connected to school is established by creating opportunities for families to engage with the school. These networks are established through our Parent Information Night and the work of the HUB. By supporting your child in creating a relationship with the school you are providing a sense of belonging.

The Framework states: When children and young people feel like they belong in a community, they're more likely to develop:

- a strong sense of identity knowing who they are
- a positive sense of self liking who they are
- strong relationships respecting others.

On Tuesday this week, students across Kindergarten to Year 6 took part in Safer Internet Day. Children talked about how to become safe and responsible digital citizens by only sharing personal information with people they trust and keeping their online activities safe.
