Dear Parents

This weekend is the Feast of Corpus Christi. Corpus Christi Cathedral is a cathedral church located in Corpus Christi, Texas, United States. Question: "What is the meaning of Corpus Christi?" Answer: The words Corpus Christi literally mean "body of Christ" in Latin. Corpus Christi, also called the Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ, is a religious festival celebrated by many Roman Catholics on the first Thursday after Trinity Sunday, which is the first Sunday after Pentecost.

Today at Sacred Heart we celebrated International Battens Awareness Day. The children were delighted to listen to the life stories and watch the skills of Basketball paralympians Donna Ritchie and Koen Jensen. Rad Radan from the Manly Warringah Basketball Association also coached children in small groups for a skills session. The theme of #Bounce4Battens was celebrated with the children bouncing around our school, participating in balloon volleyball, jump rope, basketball, bin toss and mini basketball drills. To continue the theme of #Bounce4Battens we chatted about the need to be resilient, especially during these COVID-19 times, and to bounce back when things don't go our way. Thank you to the Riddle family, Mrs. Nolan Brown, Mrs Munro and Miss Cahill and the Year 6 students for organizing this awareness raising day.

We are attempting to re-open our canteen at school, without volunteers, without cash and without counter service! On a positive note lunch orders may be purchased via QKR for Thursday and Friday for this week only. We will evaluate whether the canteen is able to operate under these restrictions until the end of the term.

Parent teacher interviews commenced this week by Zoom or phone connection. The interviews will be held this week and next. Spaces are still available for parents to book through COMPASS. Please read all the information in COMPASS which explains where and how to book. Semester one reports will be emailed home to parents in Week 10.

The school contacted the Northern beaches Council about the congestion at afternoon pick up, seeking an extension of the Kiss and Ride Zone. We received the following reply:

"For those schools that have contacted us about our offer for additional temporary Kiss and Drop areas, we can no longer implement a temporary solution because of the rapidly changing status of Covid-19 requirements."

The council did offer the following suggestions:

"School drop off and pick up times are the riskiest times for safety around schools and when our children are most vulnerable. The introduction of school zones in 2001 decreased pedestrian casualties (aged 5-16) in school zones during school zone times by 46%. This is a great result, but children are still at risk around schools. School zones increase visibility of students coming and going from our schools and slow the speed of cars, but have not reduced congestion which can lead to frustration and risky behaviour by drivers and pedestrians.

School Zones They keep our children safe

School zones operate between 8 - 9.30am and 2.30 - 4pm on school days.

The speed limit is 40km in all school zones.

We aim to improve road safety in school zone areas to protect children on their way to and from school.

It's important to understand the road conditions and signage in school zone areas. Please assist us by keeping our roads safe and educating your children to be safe around traffic.

Child safety is paramount and we make no apology for issuing infringements to drivers illegally parked in school zones. We are continuously conducting patrols during school terms to ensure child safety around our schools.

No Parking

No Parking zones can be used to **drop off** and **pick up** children

- Drivers may stop to drop off or pick up passengers or goods for a maximum of 2 minutes.
- The driver must remain in or within 3 metres of the car
- Do not leave the vehicle unattended

Penalty \$191 and two demerit points

No Stopping

Stopping is not permitted at any time.

- Dropping off or picking up passengers is not permitted in these areas.
- A continuous yellow line on the edge of the
- road also indicates a No Stopping zone.

- Vehicles must not stop next to legally parked vehicles, even for a short time.
