Dear Parents

The readings from Isaiah 40 for next Sunday, the second Sunday of Advent, remind us that we are not abandoned which is comforting after the year that we have all been through! When all those around us are at their lowest point we must remember that there is comfort from above and comfort from those beside us. We each have a role to play in the lives of others. We may not be able to offer answers but we can offer encouragement, hope, practical care and comfort. Our God is a God who comforts.



As we move rapidly towards the end of the term we are looking at planning for our Thanksgiving liturgy. As restrictions are still in place for schools we will be unable to hold our liturgy in the church therefore we are planning a beautiful liturgy in the playground for students. Traditionally the Year 6 leaders for the following year are announced at this celebration and this tradition will continue this year. Parents of the leaders for 2021 will be emailed an invitation to the Thanksgiving liturgy. Unfortunately other parents will be unable to attend this year. The liturgy will be held on Wednesday, 16 December at 10am in the school grounds. The badges for the leadership positions will be presented formally to the leaders at the opening school Mass in 2021- restrictions permitting!

Pittwater Parish is renowned for its 5 pm children's Mass on Christmas Eve. So far we have not been notified of the times of Christmas Eve and Christmas Day Masses. Fr Bronek is awaiting approval from the Bishop. As soon as this information is available we will inform parents what time and where the Masses will be held and how families can book their attendance.

Advent tips

1.Prepare your heart. Begin preparing for Advent through prayer. Offer your heart as a dwelling place for the Holy family to live in. Ask Jesus, Joseph and Mary to help you live out Advent as a time to prepare and wait for the coming of Jesus' birth.



- 2.Set up a space for prayer. You don't need anything fancy to set up a prayer space. All you need is an Advent wreath. If you don't have an Advent wreath or your budget is limited, you can buy three purple candles and a pink one to light up as the weeks in Advent pass or you can set up a Nativity set without baby Jesus in the manger. You can place the image of the child in the manger on Christmas day before opening gifts.
- 3. Don't forget those in need. Jesus came to serve, so following in his footsteps we should consider how we could serve our brothers and sisters in need. November and December are some of the busiest times for volunteer centres. If you can't find a place to serve in person, you can always make and send cards to those in hospitals or in nursing homes. Many times patients in the hospital or the elderly in nursing homes are happy to receive cards from people who are thinking of them.

That way everyone is aware of the rules and can keep themselves safe online as well as spending time for personal fitness and wellbeing.

Did you know there is a YouTube for Kids? (This is a safer option for your children as Youtube really is for people over 17)

Parents can create an account according to age group:

pre-school (4 and under), younger (5 to 7), and older (8 to 12).

What can you as a parent do to support your child at home?

Monitor and have a talk about the apps you are allowing your child to use. Another suggestion is to always be on the apps your child is using and have a regular digital safety conversation with your child about what your expectation is and what you consider appropriate behaviours. Try and be a role model to your child about responsible use of devices. Encourage open conversations around usage as well as being visible to others in the home. Set time limits and keep rewards and consequences easy to uphold.

Check the settings on the app- are they in Private as some apps by default are public unless the privacy settings have been changed.
