Dear Parents

The numbers of homeless people are increasing at an alarming rate, all major charities are alerting us to this inconvenient discovery. We've become used to addicts, alcoholics, people who've opted out and have chosen life on the street, mentally ill people, runaways and people who've been rejected by their families. Now we have people who have defaulted on their mortgage payments, people have been laid off work. People are becoming homeless because of the deepening global economic debacle and pandemic.

What is the response of our community to this fast escalating reality. One man in the gospel story was vilified and expelled from the temple, too inconvenient to have around. We could just keep them out of sight, out of mind. And

then we hear "I was hungry and you fed me....." and we remember that as Christian people our commitment is to seek and work for the good of the whole community.

It is Lent still and I wonder what might change in our level of awareness, in the way we view our world and in the way we respond to what we see. Our homeless brothers and sisters are not far out of sight if we look carefully. Like the man born blind, maybe we can begin to see with new eyes, and see our way clear to act in the light of what we see.
