Dear Parents

The Resurrection isn't just a happy ending to a sad story, it is the beginning of a new story not only for the disciples of Jesus but for Jesus' disciples of today – us. This extract from a Newspaper editorial, offers real relevance to the Easter Story.

"Easter is essentially a universal story that reflects and reinforces this message: that if we allow it to happen, light can overpower the dark, that despite the fact that we live in an unpredictable world where unimaginable suffering can seemingly appear out of nowhere, it need not in the end overwhelm us.

It is also a reminder of the fact that this is not the end of the story. That its final chapter is not an end but the possibility of a new beginning."

ICAS 2021

Sacred Heart Mona Vale will be participating once again in the International Competitions and Assessment for Schools (ICAS). Students in Years 3 to 6 have been invited to participate in the 2021 International Competitions and Assessment for Schools (ICAS) in English, Mathematics, Digital Technologies, Science, Writing and Spelling.



Students in Year 2 have been invited to participate in English, Mathematics, Science and Spelling.

The competition is an initiative of Educational Assessment Australia (EAA) of the University of New South Wales. It should be noted that these are <u>NOT TESTS</u>. These are competitions and are not necessarily based on the stage outcomes the children are working on, as often, they are set at the stage above. All students receive a Certificate and an individual Student Report indicating which questions they answered correctly, as well as the average mark for their state.

These competitions /assessments are not compulsory. Competitions are held at school over the following days:

- Medals and Certificates are awarded at the discretion of EAA



Ride 2 School



O Compass

A reminder on when to enter absences using Compass:

- 1. Partial day absences (arrive late / depart early). Use the Compass Kiosk located at the Office front desk only (not via the compass parent portal at home).
- 2. Full day absences. Use the Compass parent portal at home to advise of whole day absences.

Entering partial absences creates a 'conflict' on the system which results in the office deleting the data you have entered. Students who arrive late or depart early should be accompanied by a parent or carer to the office and signed in/out at the Kiosk accordingly.






