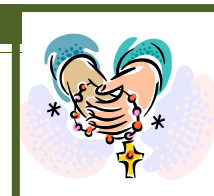

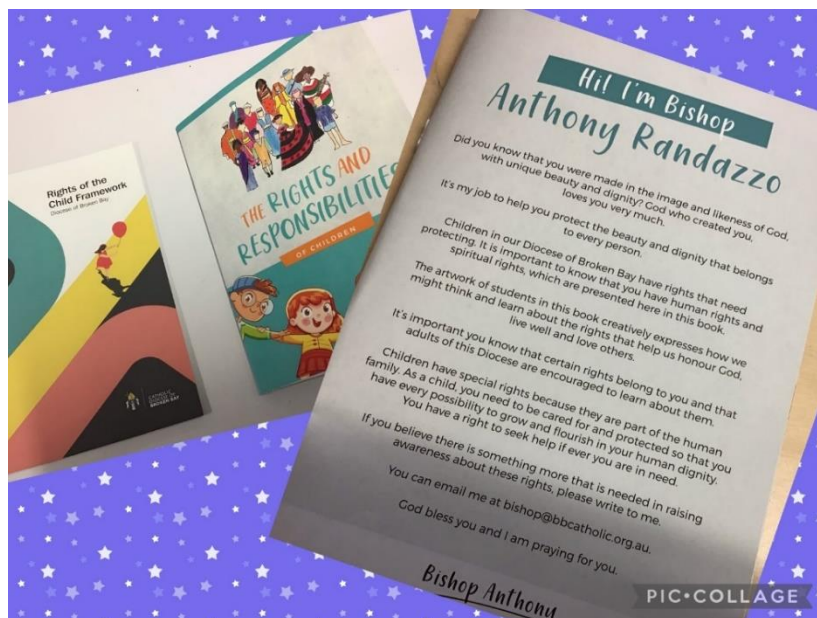

Community and Belonging- Mother’s Day

We are so blessed at Sacred Heart to have a vibrant community and this was made clear this week at the Mother’s Day Breakfast and Liturgy. The children displayed such love and pride in their school and these special women. The prayerful liturgies saw children and their mother’s demonstrate such reverence and prayer. 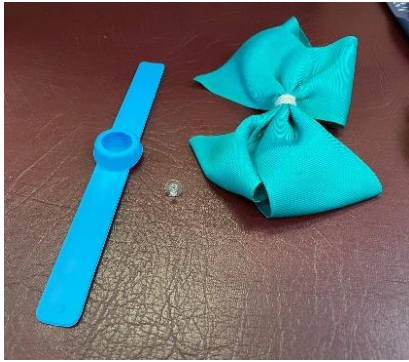

Diverse Learners

This term we have many exciting opportunities for our students to improve and excel in their learning, especially in the area of writing. Writing Groups are continuing in Years 3 and 5 with Mrs Ngamu and Mrs Wood. The writing groups allow the students to work in small groups with other students of similar ability. In these groups the children focus on specific writing techniques and develop a range of skills which enables them to create interesting material for their audience whilst further developing their passion for writing.

We also have a number of students participating in the Gateways Writing Program this term: Tales of the Unexpected. Gateways is an independent organisation which provides learning opportunities for students with particular strengths in nominated curriculum areas. Selected students join with a number of children across a variety of schools to participate in workshops to challenge them, to further explore their creativity, to develop their skills and help develop their individual talents. These are one day workshops. Each term the curriculum focus of the workshops differ so across the year many children are given the opportunity to participate if they display a particular talent in the given area. Places are limited so students are selected based on our assessment criteria.
