As you would be aware, I am retiring after 33 years in Catholic Education and 17 years as a Catholic School Principal, 7 years here at Sacred Heart. I have had an amazing professional career and have had the privilege of working with the most beautiful children, families and staff doing the most rewarding work, educating for the future and sharing my faith so others come to know and love Christ.

I have been so fortunate to have worked with some amazing religious people. I must mention in particular the Salvatorians from the Parish of Pittwater who are inspirational in their ministry - in particular Fr Richard, Fr Bronek and Fr George and their wonderful admin Suzy and Laura.

As I reflect on the years here at Sacred Heart I have wonderful memories having worked with the most passionate Assistant Principals, Mrs McBryde, Mrs Ngamu and Mrs Wheen, loyal leadership teams including Mrs Nolan-Brown, Mrs Driscoll, Mrs Williams, the hard working Admin staff Mrs Bartlett, Mrs Calleia and Mrs Andrews, supportive P & F teams led by Mrs J Johnston, Mrs A Lewis and Mr G Howard, Mrs K Warner-Smith, many hard working teachers and finally hundreds of beautiful children and their families. To all of you I would like to say thankyou for supporting me in my role as Principal of Sacred Heart. Thankyou for your friendship.

Last Friday evening the school and parish hosted a beautiful retirement celebration in the Parish centre. I was so humbled with the attendance of many Principals, teachers and parents as Fr Richard, Mr G Howard representing the Sacred Heart parent body and A Duncan representing the Diocesan Director, with my family recognised my contribution to Catholic education. Thankyou for the beautiful gift and to the liturgical dancers and singers who impressed all who attended.

What a fabulous community we have here at Mona Vale. We have many blessings here at Sacred Heart but we also have our challenges. Our enrolment numbers have increased showing the demand for our school in the local area, our Naplan results improved thanks to the dedicated commitment of our teaching staff and our children's wellbeing a primary focus. We have been challenged over the years by the Catholic Schools funding crisis, scandal and corruption within the Catholic Church and two years of a worldwide pandemic. We have celebrated and cried together always with our children being first and foremost at the heart of all we do.

The Covid-19 pandemic and consequent restrictions on schools in the past 2 years resulted in restrictions on the learning programs and our usual community celebrations. I am immensely proud of the way the teaching staff approached the home learning challenges and of the way our student and families embraced the challenges. There was much learning particularly around technology, independence, flexibility and resilience. I hope and pray that 2022 will be a year of new beginnings for the school and a return to the full and wonderful celebrations of community including whole school Masses.

Help us walk in that love during the weeks of Advent,


As we wait and prepare for his coming.

The third candle is the candle of Joy. It signifies the joy that the world can experience. It is the Pink candle and the reason for it being rose/pink is that is the liturgical colour of joy.



Why not bring Advent into your home and create your own Nativity Scene?

Create your own Nativity Scene

Materials:

- Contact paper
- Nativity Silhouette
- Colourful tissue paper cut into squares
- Scissors

Instructions:

- Print and cut out your nativity (search Nativity Silhouette- there are some excellent ones on Google)
- Lay out your contact paper sticky side up.
- Centre your nativity silhouette on top of the contact paper.
- Begin placing squares of tissue paper inside the activity silhouette to create the look of stained glass.
- Once the nativity is filled with tissue paper, lay a second sheet of contact paper on top of the entire project. Be careful not to trap air bubbles.
- Trim the excess contact paper with scissors.
- You can either tape your stained-glass nativity to your window or use a hole punch and hang it from a string. Either way, it will look great.
