Advent

This week is the 2nd Week of Advent. During the second week of Advent we listen to the call of John the Baptist to make the way for the Lord. We are called in Sunday's Gospel reading to listen to the Old Testament and the Book of Isaiah. This week, let's aim to hear the voice of Jesus in our lives.





A voice cries in the wilderness: Prepare a way for the Lord, make his paths straight. Every valley will be filled in, every mountain and hill be laid low, winding ways will be straightened and rough roads made smooth. And all mankind shall see the salvation of God.

The second candle is the candle of peace, a sign that God's promise to his chosen people will be the Prince of Peace.

Why not bring Advent into your home and create your own Advent Wreath?

Create your own Advent Wreath



1 Purchase some cardboard, scrapbooking paper or cardstock (2 different greens and red)

2. Trace your child's hand to make a template. Cut out template and then trace about 24 hands. 12 in each green coloured cardboard.

3. Cut the hands out

4. Draw a 25cm donut shape as a base for your wreath. From the green cardboard. Cut this out.

- 5. Glue the cut out hands as shown on the donut shape to form a wreath.
- 6. Trace and cut out berry shapes from the red cardstock
- 7. Now you have a wreath for you advent candles you made in week 1.
