# **TERM 4 OVERVIEW**

### **RELIGION:**

This term the students will continue their focus on 'Mission' and will lead a whole school focus on Catholic Mission and Socktober. Students will also focus on Advent and Christmas.

### **MATHS**

This term the Mathematics program will cover a range of sub-strands in Number, Measurement and Geometry and Statistics and Probability.

- Number: Addition and Subtraction,
   Multiplication and Division, Fractions and
   Decimals
- Measurement and Geometry: Length, Area
- Statistics and Probability: Chance and Data

### SCIENCE AND TECHNOLOGY

This term we focus on a Digital Technology unit. This unit focuses on digital systems and how they transmit data. Students explore different types of data, learn how to interpret patterns and develop skills in visual programming. Students will further develop their knowledge and understanding of computational thinking and abstraction. They will learn how to follow and describe algorithms. Students will use algorithms to code.

### **PDHPE**

The students will continue the unit on Child Protection until the end of the term. In this unit Students will identify roles, rights and responsibilities in different relationships, exploring how they can influence theirs and others emotional and social wellbeing. They will recognise types of abuse and bullying behaviours and will practise strategies they can employ when they themselves feel unsafe or they see others in need of assistance or help.

#### **ENGLISH**

**Reading** The children will participate in daily reading each morning. Students will work independently on spelling, punctuation, grammar and reading comprehension activities.

Writing The focus text types this term are poetry, narratives and discussions. They will also have opportunities to write creatively on topics of their choice and in other genres. Writing tasks will focus on the various facets of grammar, including punctuation, parts of writing (e.g. nouns, adjectives, speech marks) and correct sentence structure.

**Handwriting** This term they are continuing to learn joined foundation handwriting.

**Speaking and Listening** Oral Language discussions are held daily and there will be opportunities for the children to communicate through individual and group presentations.

# **HSIE - Geography**

This term we continue our Geography unit titled "Places are Similar and Different". The geographical inquiry process will investigate the location and geographical characteristics of Australia's neighbouring countries. This includes the investigation of the natural characteristics of a country in Asia in the content area 'Different environments' in the focus area 'The Earth's environment'.

### **VISUAL ARTS**

Throughout Term 4, we are integrating Visual Art with our Geography unit 'Australia and Its Neighbours'. Asia is colourful and culturally unique. We will explore architecture, customs, dress, the environment, food and traditions through diverse art experiences.
